

**Pilot Aquatic Club
Family Participation Requirements 2010-11
Swim Meet Contract**

Please review and sign. This contract must be signed and turned in before your child can be entered into a meet.

- Pilot Aquatic Club hosts several meets throughout the year. These meets generate revenue for the club and are necessary to keep swim fees affordable to our families. Home meets also give our swimmers an advantage since they can compete in familiar surroundings and enjoy the comforts of their own homes.
- Each family will be required to work a certain number of job sessions at each home meet in which their child participates, with the exception of the State High School Meet and Southeastern Championships (if Pilot hosts), in which all families will be required to work a minimal number of job sessions. Hosting these additional meets is a great privilege and opportunity for our Club and it gives the younger swimmers early exposure to fun and exciting high level swim meets.
- Session Work Requirements (per family):
 - *November PACK Meet, 4 out of 7 sessions required (461 workers needed)
 - *January PACK Meet, 4 out of 7 sessions required (483 workers needed)
 - *June PACK Meet, 4 out of 9 sessions required (375 workers needed)
 - **February State Meet, 3 out of 4 sessions required (263 workers needed)
 - **July Southeasterns LC Championships, 5 out of 9 sessions required (411 workers needed)
(Pilot will not know until October if Pilot will host Southeasterns)
- *Families in which the eldest swimmer is in the 8 and under category are only required to work 2 job sessions at each home meet.
- ** Whether competing or not, State Meet will require all families work at least 1 job session and Southeasterns will require all families work at least 2 job sessions.
- Amy Penn and Leann Burns are our Meet Worker Coordinators for the 2010-11 season. Worker sign ups will be available approximately 10 days prior to each upcoming home meet via the internet. The earlier you sign up, the greater the variety of jobs available.
- At each meet, there will be a worker registration table for you to “sign in” when you arrive at the pool. This table will be located in the lobby of the Aquatic Center. Once you sign in, you will receive a worker tag that must be worn for you to be permitted on the pool deck. It is your responsibility to make sure that you have signed in properly.
- If you are not able to work the meets your children are swimming, it is **YOUR** responsibility to find someone to work for you, or you will be fined. For **each session** that you fail to work, your escrow will be charged **\$50.00** and must be paid before your child will be entered into another meet; home or away. **We do not want your money... we want your help!** If you sign up to work a session and fail to show up to work that session, you will be fined **\$50.00**. Pilot cannot run successful meets without 100% parent participation and we really do appreciate all that you do.
- Meet workers must be at least in the **9th** grade and **15 years** or older. Once again, these are “family” work requirements. Mom and dad, grandparents, aunts/uncles, nieces/nephews who meet the age requirements can also work for you.
- Each family will also be required to donate food items at each meet for our hospitality room. Our hospitality room provides food and relaxation to the coaches and officials who volunteer numerous hours. These individuals not only work all the sessions, but many hours prior to the meet as well. Pilot Aquatic Club is known for its tradition of providing first class meals and snacks to these hard working individuals.
